- Review practice activities given.

- Provide math problem solving strategies, and suggest websites to practice math fluency.
- Provide a weekly reading log for each student and suggest reading websites and apps to use at home.
- Provide vocabulary and suggest activities for practice in the weekly class newsletter.

At Home

Hunters Glen Elementary families can support students' success in reading and math in the following ways:

- Provide support for my child with weekly math problem solving strategies, and have my child access websites when available.
- Provide support for my child for 30 minutes of nightly reading practice and sign completed reading log.
- Review vocabulary with child that is provided on the weekly class newsletter.

Hunters Glen Elementary Third Grade Students

Hunters Glen Elementary Third Grade Students will reach success in Reading and Math in the following ways:

- Practice grade level math problem solving skills every day and math fluency activities.
- Practice reading for 30 minutes each night and complete reading summary by Friday of each week.
- Daily review vocabulary for each unit.

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HGE Fourth Grade Goals

Goal 1:

At least 75% of all Fourth Grade students will show growth on Math CFAs by moving up at least one scoring category.

In Fourth Grade, we will focus on the following areas: Reading comprehension, fluency, and inferencing.

Goal 2:

At least 75% of all Fourth Grade students will show growth on Reading CFAs by moving up at least one scoring category.

In Fourth Grade, we will focus on the following areas: Math word problem solving and algebraic reasoning.

Goal 3:

In Fourth Grade, we will focus on the following areas: punctuation, paraphrasing, and verb tense.

- Provide opportunities to practice writing conventions, including punctuation marks, paraphrasing, and verb tense.

At Home

Hunters Glen Elementary families can support students' success in reading and math in the following ways:

- Review math homework, provide support with weekly spiral math activities, and utilize Schoology for parent-teacher communication and helpful websites.
- Provide support student with reading practice and encourage 30 minutes of reading each night.
- Review writing expectation, study guides, and helpful resources to promote strong writers.
