General

Criteria for Off Campus or Office Aide

- I will have 21 credits by the end of May.
- I have passed all STAAR EOC exams (English 1, 2, Algebra 1, Biology, and US History) by May
- I do not have any make-up hours to complete due to excessive absences.
- I do not have any credits to recover (i.e. Edgenuity, summer school).
- I understand I will not receive credit or grade points for off campus or office aide. I will leave/arrive to campus when expected.
- If I am unable to maintain passing grades during senior year, I will be removed from off campus or office aide and placed in Edgenuity (online credit program).



College, Career, and Military Readiness (CCMR)

What is CCMR?

CCMR stands for college, career, and military readiness. A CCMR indicator is a measure of a student's preparedness post-secondary whether they choose to attend college, enter the workforce, or join the military. Meeting a CCMR indicator before graduation not only benefit students in their post-secondary interests but also qualifies them for certain district provided incentives. As a priority of FBISD CCMR initiative, students will **not** be scheduled into off campus or office aide **until** they have met their CCMR indicator.



College Career and Military Readiness (CCMR) is not new. It has been a Fort Bend ISD and state priority to ensure all high schools support graduates to become college, career, and/or military-ready. We continue building out our plan in addition to the existing avenues, including Career Pathways with industry certifications, TSI, AP, UT Onramps- Dual Enrollment, Dual Credit, and/or military recruitment opportunities.

How can I earn a CCMR indicator?



Ways to earn an indicator in the spring and summer of 2025:

- **Now** and going forward: TSI-A test
- **March**: SAT School Day test results in April
- **May**: Earned credit in an OnRamps course.
- **May**: Earned 3 credit hours in a math or English dual credit course.
- **May**: Earned 9 credit hours in dual credit outside math and English:
 - Example: US History dual credit 1 and 2, dual credit sociology = 9 credit hours

July- August:

- AP Exam results
- Summer dual credit total 9 credit hours

Grade Level: Sophomore, Juniors, & Seniors

- College Transitions (EDUC 1300)
- Professional Communications (SPCH 1315)

Grade Level: Seniors Only

- English Composition I (ENGL 1301)→Fall
- English Composition II (ENGL 1302)→Spring
- College Algebra (MATH 1314)→Spring only but with an independent study math class in the fall term slot

Open August 1st!

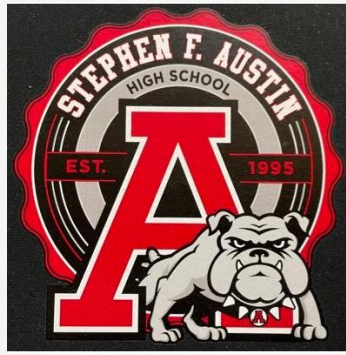
Senior Year

- Access is through 1Link→Clever→SchoolLinks
- Resources:
 - Set goals, search colleges and careers, and create a resume (brag sheet)
 - Features employer showcases, virtual workplace tours
 - College/career event sign ups and scholarship opportunities
- SENIOR YEAR: Hub for sending letters of recommendations to colleges and sending transcripts to colleges, for scholarships, and NCAA
- Your Dashboard will show you related tasks you need to complete!
