### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Foundation Plan + Endorsement 26 credits

Distinguished Level of Achievement 26 credits
\*\*(includes Algebra 2)

- 4 credits English ELA I, II, III, IV or one credit in any authorized advanced English course
- 4 credits Mathematics Algebra I, Geometry, two credits in any authorized advanced math course
- 4 credits Science Biology, IPC/ Chemistry/ Physics, and two credits in any authorized science course
- 3 credits Social Studies US History, Government, Economics, World Geography or World History
- 2 credits World Language or Computer Science (level I and level II)
- 1 credit Physical Education
- 1 credit Fine Arts
- .5 credit Health (FBISD)
- .5 credit Speech (FBISD)
- 6 credits in electives (may include CTE or certification courses)
- Credit requirements specific to at least one endorsement

Passing classes for the year

- earn a 70 or higher in each of your 7 classes
  - earn 0.5 (half credit) for each semester course
- Semester averaging
  - (S1-60 + S2-80: yearly average = 70)
- \*\*If a student is not successful, they may recover credits via summer school/night school.

- 4) World Geography (on level or AAC) or AP Human Geo
- 5) PE (PE, Dance 1, Band (two years), athletics, JROTC 1)
- 6) Fine Art or Health & Speech
- 7) Endorsement elective
- \*\*If currently taking level 1 of a foreign language, sign up for level 2.
- \*\*Bilingual students should consider a Credit by Exam.
- \*\*If selecting AAC/AP, consider taking AVID.

# **APTESTING**

### Test Dates and other info

- Sign up for AP testing in the Fall of the school year. Tests this year were \$99.
- Test are normally offered in May of the school year.
- AP Tests count toward College credit.
- Credits only transfer to certain Colleges/Universities. It is the student's job to check on the AP transfer policy for the specific university.
- You do <u>not</u> have to take the AP test just because you are in the AP course; however, it is recommended.
- There is a \$40 cancellation fee that applies to students who change their mind on testing after the exam order deadline.

# ACCOMMODATIONS FOR COLLEGE BOARD TESTS

AP Testing & Accommodations: Visit College Board.org - STAAR/EOC: Visit TEA website for test features and question types.

College Board Tests: PSAT, SAT, AP

Who should consider applying? If student is receiving accomm. through Special Education, 504, or Emergent Bilingual services

Request must be initiated by the parent/guardian

Requests can take up to 7 weeks to process

If College Board has not approved the accommodation, we <u>cannot</u> give it to the student

Accommodations on file with the school for Special Education, 504, and/or Emergent Bilingual students do NOT apply
