

Consider the following before having your child sign up for advanced courses:


- Do they enjoy a particular subject and are motivated to learn more about it?



#### Dollars and Sense (.5 high school credit, Spring only) 7-8


- consumer practices, money-management, decision-making

#### Robotics and Engineering I – Grades 7-8

- Problem-based, hands-on; utilize the Engineering Design Process
- Computational thinking, machines, force and motion, basic circuitry, electricity, energy transformations, and rocketry

#### Robotics and Engineering II (must have taken Rob I)

 Unit studies may include: robotics careers, advanced robotics, sensors and circuits, gaming peripherals, turbine design, physics concepts, space exploration, advanced coding, mechanical and electrical engineering, and human flight



## World Language 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Only

#### **WORLD LANGUAGE:**

FL112 Spanish I \*
1 High School Credit – Regular Level
FL 1021 Spanish for Spanish Speakers I \*
2 High School Credits – Regular Level
(Will be offered only if there is enough interest)

If you take Spanish I in 8<sup>th</sup> grade, you should plan to take Spanish II during your 9<sup>th</sup> grade year.

You must earn TWO full credits in the same world language to meet your high school graduation requirements.

So, if you don't take Spanish in 8<sup>th</sup> grade it's okay. You have time in high school.



Tips to consider for Spanish:

- The student should have a good understanding and grasp of the English language, including grammar and vocabulary.
- The student should have strong reading and writing skills and be able to memorize and master concepts of the language, not just colors, numbers, etc.
- The student needs to be prepared to work hard, both in the classroom and at home. Learning a foreign language requires consistent studying at home on a daily basis.
- The student should expect to have homework often, perhaps every day, and lots of quizzes and tests, both written and oral.
- The student should have good organizational skills in order to keep up with assignments and the pace of the course.
- The student should understand that this is a high school academic course that will be recorded on their high school transcript for grade points.

All HS credit courses, whether it is a core class or an elective, AND whether you pass it or fail it, will be recorded on your high school transcript.

If you are not motivated or prepared to do high school level work, do not take it. It will affect your Grade Point Average.







## **Schedule Corrections/Changes**



- In the early spring of each school year, students are given the opportunity to choose courses after having met with their counselor for an informational session.
- In March, students are given an opportunity to verify their course request in Skyward Family Access.
- After that time, the Master Schedule is developed.
  The student course requests are used to make
  decisions about the number of sections of each
  course.
- Therefore, after the Master Schedule has been created, there are very few slots available to accommodate late request for changes.

- In order to maintain balance of classroom numbers and minimize disruptions, schedule changes will be made for the following reasons.
  - A student has already taken a class in which they are currently scheduled.
  - A male has been scheduled into a female PE/Athletics, or vice versa.
  - A student is in a class for which they do not have the appropriate prerequisite (i.e., enrolled in Spanish II and has not taken Spanish I).

A student requiring a schedule correction must complete a Schedule Change Request Form and submit it to their counselor. The deadline for all schedule corrections is 9 days after the start of each semester.

In general, elective change requests will not be honored. However, if a student is trying to move from a regular elective into an extracurricular program (i.e., band, choir, and athletics) the request for the change will be considered but must be initiated by the coach/program director.







- Click the **rhombus** for all other electives you will see fine arts in here as well, but it's confusing if you click them in here, so don't click them!







If you are on the athletics list, you will choose pe and I will go in and change to athletics. The coaches must approve you to be in athletics.










If you don't have alternates and one of your top choice electives is full, I will choose a replacement elective for you – this means you will get the least populated elective.
