WHAT ARE .. ACCOMMODATIONS?

An example of an accommodation would be if a student who has difficulty writing were to be given the opportunity to provide his responses verbally. This student is still expected to know the same content and answer the same questions as the other students, but he/she is not required to write his answers in order to demonstrate that he/she is aware of the information to demonstrate that he is knowledgeable about it.

WHAT ARE MODIFICATIONS?

An example of a modification would a change to the grade level TEKS that the student will need to demonstrate mastery for in order to be able to meet them where they are at, so they can demonstrate growth and success.



ACCOMMODATIONS VS MODIFICATIONS

- Helps students access the same curriculum as their peers.
- Helps students navigate and surmount their disabilities,
- Facilitates the participation of students with disabilities in the general curriculum
- extracurricular activities
- And supports the achievement of IEP objectives.
- **The key is that accommodations help the student access the same content as their classmates, while modifications change the actual work the student is expected to do.

- Alter the curriculum itself.
- Alter the instructional Level
- Alter requisite Assignments
- Alter the competencies a learner is required to achieve



Parents can assist in identifying accommodations and modifications for their child during the Admission, Review, and Dismissal (ARD) meeting

Parents can take part in the ARD process through:

- Parents and educational staff collaborate to design the Individual Education Program (IEP) during the ARD meeting.
- The IEP is a written outline agenda summarizing the special education services for the child
- putting forward questions
- conveying matters of interest
- pressing for their child.
- Providing their insights into your child's talents, weaknesses, hobbies, and learning preferences.

THE ARD PROCESS



Eligibility	Accommodations	Modifications
Learning Disability	Extra time on tests, use of a calculator, audio books, preferential seating, visual aids, graphic organizers	Simplified reading materials, reduced number of problems or questions, alternative assignments
Speech or Language Impairment	Visual aids, graphic organizers, extra time to process and respond, use of communication devices	Simplified language in instructions and materials, alternative assignments that allow for different ways of demonstrating knowledge
Autism Spectrum Disorder	Preferential seating, visual schedules, social stories, sensory breaks, clear and concise instructions	Simplified language in instructions and materials, alternative assignments that allow for different ways of demonstrating knowledge, reduced distractions in the learning environment
Emotional Disability	Preferential seating, positive reinforcement, frequent breaks, clear expectations and consequences, counseling services	Simplified language in instructions and materials, alternative assignments that allow for different ways of demonstrating knowledge, reduced distractions in the learning environment
Physical Impairment	Adaptive equipment, preferential seating, extra time on tasks, assistance with physical tasks	Adapted materials, alternative assignments that allow for different ways of demonstrating knowledge, modified physical education activities
Other Health Impairment	Preferential seating, extra time on tasks, frequent breaks, accommodations for medical needs	Simplified language in instructions and materials, alternative assignments that allow for different ways of demonstrating knowledge, modified physical education activities

Accommodations and Modifications in the classroom

Both accommodations and modifications are tailored to the individual and important in different ways to help the student succeed in the classroom.

A Teacher will ensure and document these accommodations are used in the classroom every day


- Extra time on tests or assignments
- Using a computer or calculator for math work
- Sitting in a quiet area of the classroom to avoid distractions
- Having instructions or materials read out loud

If the student has modifications, the teacher will adjust the student's work and assignments to match the modifications.

- Using textbooks or materials that are at the student's reading level, even if it's below grade level
- Reducing the number of math problems the student needs to complete
- Allowing the student to demonstrate their knowledge in a different way, like making a poster instead of a written report

BENEFITS OF ACCOMMODATIONS AND MODIFICATIONS

- Helps the student learn better Allows the student to focus on learning, not just struggling with the work
- Boosts the student's confidence Helps the student feel proud of their achievements
- Allows the student to participate more Helps the student take part in class activities and discussions
- Reduces stress and frustration Takes pressure off the student to do work that is too hard for them
