- Are you able to stay focused on a task for an extended period of time?
- Can you complete assignments independently?
- Are you an enthusiastic reader and writer?
- Do you have time each week outside of school to devote to <u>each</u> AAC class on your schedule?
- Do you like a challenge?
- Were you highly successful academically in Reading and Writing in 5th grade?

Things to Keep in Mind

- Students who are used to making A's in elementary Reading and Writing may make their first B or C in an AAC class.
- A "B" is considered successful in a 6th Grade AAC ELA course.
- Many 6th graders take on too many AAC courses and find that they do not have enough time or self-discipline to keep up with the workload and make good grades.

Remember that you will also have to:

- Do work for other classes
- Participate in activities
- Have family time
- Eat
- Socialize
- Sleep
