### SCHOOL DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

Thurgood Marshall High School opened its doors to the first Buffalos on August 15, 2002, under Superintendent Dr. Betty Baitland and Principal Bob Banks. The campus was named after the Honorable Thurgood Marshall, the first African American Supreme Justice.

### SCHOOL INFORMATION:

- Seniors: 288, Juniors: 369, Sophomores: 390, Freshman: 489
- Faculty: 119 – 26.74% have master's degrees and beyond
- Block Schedule: Classes meet 90 minutes per day with 4 periods per day. Block A classes are 1<sup>st</sup> -4<sup>th</sup> periods and Block B classes are 5<sup>th</sup> -8<sup>th</sup> periods. Students attend classes 5 days each week, 18 weeks per semester.
- School Year: August 11, 2021 to May 26, 2022
- Accreditation: Southern Association of Secondary Schools and the Texas Education Agency

### CURRICULUM

- Marshall provides a strong academic program with more than 100 possible course selections.
- Students are able to go to the Technical Education Center throughout the day.
- Over 10 Advanced Placement courses are available in Spanish Language and Culture, Calculus AB, Biology, Physics 1: Algebra Based, U.S. History, World History, Psychology, Government & Politics: United States, Macroeconomics, English Literature and Composition, and English Language and Composition.
- UIL-sponsored athletic programs for young men and women are offered in football, basketball, tennis, track, soccer, golf, swimming, volleyball, baseball, softball and diving.
- Co-curricular programs include choir, band, orchestra, drill team, student council, service and academic clubs, athletics and Academic Decathlon.
- Gifted and Talented programs are available in English, Math, Science and Social Studies.
- Instruction is available for special needs through Special Education and Bilingual/ESOL instruction.
- The Early College Program (ECHS) for students to earn an Associate degree during high school.

## CLASS RANK

- All high school credit courses attempted are included in the calculation of the GPA
- The GPA system utilized in FBISD is referred to as the "100 Point Scale"
- GPA is calculated by adding semester averages earned and dividing by semesters attempted
- Courses are weighted differently in GPA calculations used for class rank
- Grade points are assessed based on the grade and level as follows:
