We are committed to making our campus a safe school with a culture that values all students and staff. We are doing amazing things to:


- 1. Build an inclusive and safe community in which respect is the goal, and all students can thrive.




BOOK OF THE MONTH

"Llamma Llama and the Bully Goat" by Anna Dewdney


This story follows Llama Llama as he enjoys his day at school with friends—until Gilroy Goat begins teasing, name-calling, and being unkind. At first, Llama doesn't know what to do, but with guidance from the teacher, he learns that standing up to bullying, using kind words, and including others can make a big difference. Gilroy also discovers that there are better ways to be a friend.

I love this book because it helps students see that bullying is never okay, and that kindness and respect create a safe place for everyone. It reinforces the importance of speaking up, supporting one another, and giving others a chance to learn and grow. As a counselor, I value how this story opens the door to conversations about empathy, making good choices, and how to turn hurtful moments into opportunities for friendship.
