"My Pile, Your Pile": write each word on an index card and place in a pile, face down between the players. Each player takes turns turning over one card and reading it to their partner. If they read it correctly, they put it in their pile, if they misread or don't know it, they put it back at the bottom of the draw pile. The player with the most cards is the winner.

Bingo: Choose nine words at a time and lay them out in a square, face up, three cards to each row. Call out a word and the child turns over or puts a penny on that word.

Build a Word: Use magnet letters or any manipulative letters and call out one word at a time for the child to build with the letters. You can make this easier or harder:

Easier- have them identify the word on the word card first and either copy/build the word or turn it over and try to build it from memory.

Harder-Start with a simple word and add to it to make new words. For example: start with "the" and then tell your child to add one letter to make "the" into "them", then take away one letter and add one new letter to make "them" into "they"...

Tic-Tac-Toe: Stack sight word cards all together. Draw tic-tac-toe grid (#) on paper or makerboard and decide who will be X and who will be O. Players take turns turning over one card and reading it to their partner. If they read it correctly, they get to put their X or O on the gameboard and put the card at the bottom of the stack. If a player reads the word incorrectly, they miss a turn.
